REPORTING TO THE UNIVERSITY

EOA is responsible for overseeing OSU's compliance with civil rights and affirmative action laws, regulations, and policies. EOA is OSU's Title IX and Americans with Disabilities Act coordinating office. EOA responds promptly and equitably to reports of sexual misconduct and discrimination.

EOA is able to provide a range of supportive measures (referrals to resources, academic supports, on-campus housing relocation, university no contact orders, etc.) regardless of whether or not an individual participates in an EOA investigation or informal resolution process.

Reporting to EOA may initiate an investigation under the Code of Student Conduct and/or applicable OSU Policy. EOA does not share information with law enforcement, except as required to report concerns of child abuse/neglect, immediate safety concerns on campus, or threats of harm to individuals. EOA also assists with workplace, religious and crime victim accommodations for employees.

Protective orders are available to help people who have been impacted by domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, elder abuse, and persons with disabilities experiencing abuse. Individuals can provide a copy of their order to EOA or DPS; the University complies with the recognition of protection and restraining orders. OSU will assist students and employees who obtain an order with information and safety planning when requested. You can also contact your local courthouse or domestic / sexual violence advocacy center directly for assistance.

CONFIDENTIAL RESOURCES

Confidential resources can be used without reporting to police or EOA. Prior to disclosing information to any office, ask about that office's confidentiality requirements and limitations, if any. In rare circumstances, providers may need to disclose information without the person's written consent to law enforcement or other agencies, such as when a person states intent to harm themselves or someone else, if the person reports current abuse or neglect of a vulnerable adult or child, and/or as a result of a court order or subpoena.
